The Knight in Shining Armor

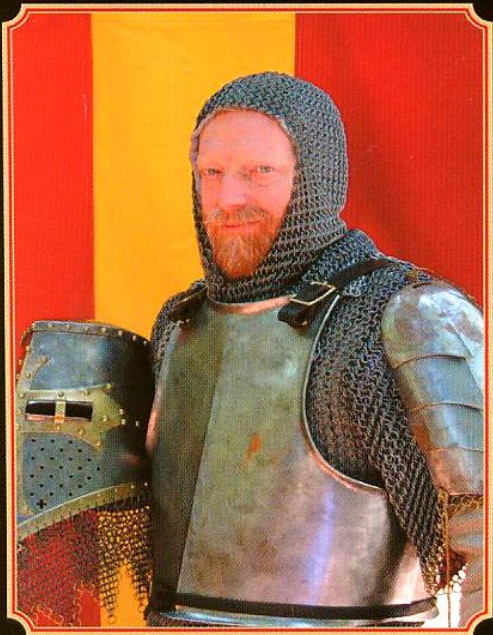

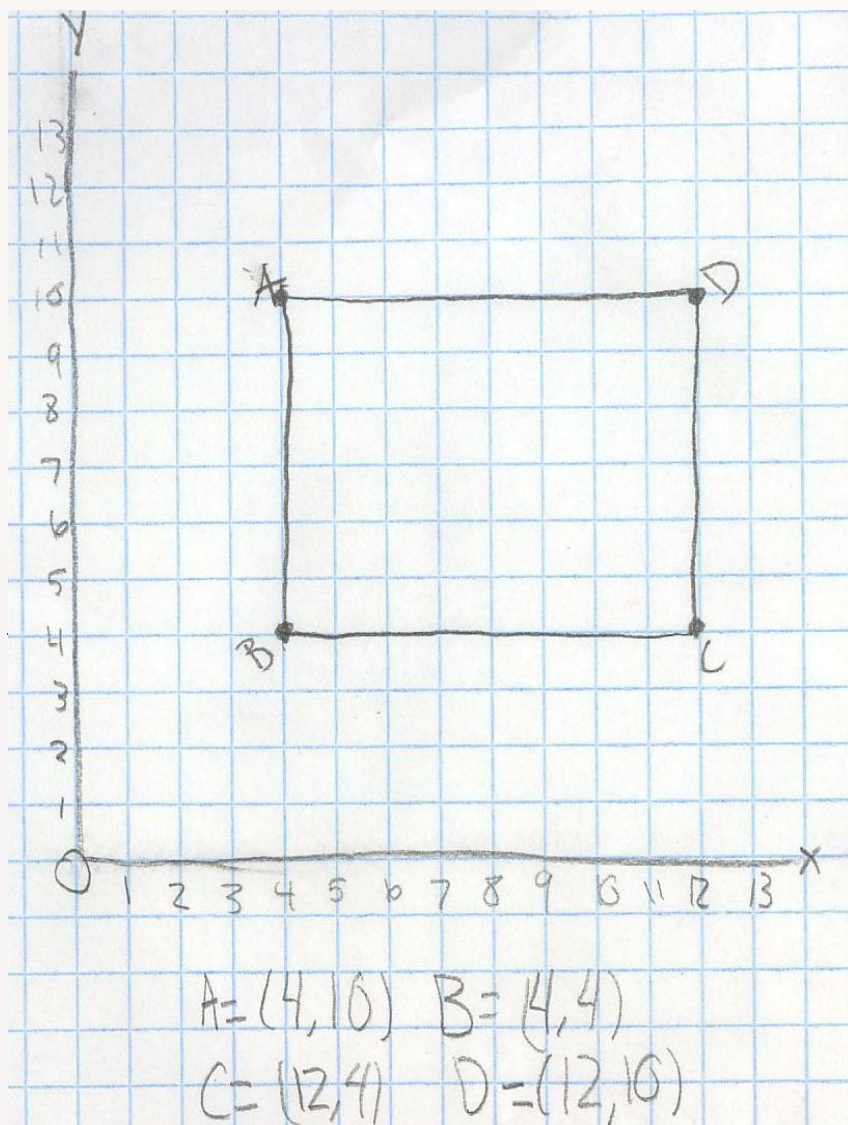
